Failure to provide any of the required information will prevent processing of your application.
- 3. Products and services must be purchased and installed between June 1, 2021, and March 31, 2026. Rebate applications must be postmarked by April 1, 2026.
- 4. Please submit one application form for the completed major measures rebate within 90 days of the installation of the major measures or date of a blower door test if air sealing was performed Installation of major measures must be completed within 120 days from the date of the energy audit.
- 5. Individual measure rebate amounts cannot exceed total cost of installation.
- 6. Quality Assurance reviews will be conducted by FirstEnergy and/or CLEAResult representatives. Work completed by a participating contractor will be reviewed on a random basis. Work completed by a homeowner will be reviewed in every case.
- 7. FirstEnergy's Pennsylvania utilities and/or their designees including program administrators and evaluation contractors reserve the right to review installations to verify completion and measure energy savings to ensure compliance with all program requirements. Such reviews will be made at a time convenient to the applicant. Misrepresentation of installation location or measure eligibility may result in forfeiture of the rebate.
- 8. Rebate payments are based on the date of service. Customers must abide by the rules and rebate levels in effect on the date of purchase.
- 9. Program procedures, requirements, and rebate levels are subject to change and/ or cancel without notice and are subject to available program funds.
